Editorial

The January-June 2021 edition of the journal *Revista IUSTA* has proposed to the academic community articles resulting from institutional research projects, whose content reveal legal novelty and complexity in the Colombian legal system. To that end, this edition offers its readers topics related to Andean Community law and Colombian land use planning; likewise, classic contents of public procurement are addressed, such as the importance of bidding documents in public works contracts. On the other hand, the edition also presents novel reflections by academics on asbestos in Colombia, on the role of legal clinics in the post-conflict and in relation to public policies in the framework of land ownership by rural women.

In view of the scarce scientific research from the tax law scenario, and from the context of correlational research, a comparative analysis between Colombian constitutional law and Colombian tax law is presented. As a topic that has shown little development in the context of scientific journals, a text is presented that develops an analysis of foreign troops from the scenario of peace. Finally, and from the framework of private law, this edition has proposed to its readers a topic on which there is no jurisprudential or doctrinal development: the wrongful conception in the field of medical liability in Colombia.
